DURAND FUNFEST 3v3 RULES
SPONSORED BY TRI-PARISH YOUTH GROUP

1. All participants, players, coaches, and fans are to behave with courtesy toward all tournament participants and officials. Our officials are volunteers. **BE POLITE AND RESPECTFUL! ALL OFFICIALS DECISIONS ARE FINAL! WITHOUT THE VOLUNTEER REFEREES THESE TOURNAMENTS WOULD NOT BE POSSIBLE.**

2. **Teams may not have more than 5 players.** Players not on the roster will not be allowed to play. The team you start the tournament with is the team you end the tournament with.

3. **Game Format** - The first possession will be determined by the flip of a coin. (or some like chance task such as odd/even or rock paper scissors)

All shots are worth their normal point value. For grades 4 and 5, the first team to 15 points wins. For grades 6, 7, and 8, the first team to 20 points wins. For grade 9 and up, the first team to 30 points wins. **ALL GAMES HAVE A 15 MINUTE TIME LIMIT.** (Please see below for tie-breakers) You do not have to win by 2 pts.

Teams must bring their own practice balls. (Some Practices balls will be provided however they will be limited)

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS FOR HALF COURT GAMES (depending on court availability):

On a jump ball, the ball will be given to the team according to the alternating possession arrow. On every dead ball, the ball must be checked at the top of the key by the defending team. The ball will be returned to play by a PASS. After any change in possession during play, the ball must be taken to the "take-back" line (3 point line) before the team with the ball may attempt to score. There will be a 15 minute time limit from the start of each game. A 2 minute half-time will be taken when the first team reaches 8 pts in grades 4-6 and 10 pts. in grades 7, 8, & open class. If neither team reaches those point totals after 10 minutes, a 2 minute half time will be taken. If the score is tied after 15 minutes a tie-breaker will be used to determine the winner. When a tie occurs at the end of regulation time, a two minute overtime will be played. If either team scores the total number of points during the over time, they will immediately win. If after the overtime period the game is still tied, the following will occur. Each player from each team will shoot 1 free-throw with the team making the most free throws winning. (If a team has less than 5 players, they will shoot another for each player less than five.) Each team is allowed 2 one minute time-outs per game. The clock will stop when a time-out is taken. Teams must attack the basket on the offense. No stalling will be allowed. If there is a lack of activity by the offense the official will first warn the team and if it should occur again then it will be followed with loss of possession. All other normal rules of basketball are still in effect.

THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS FOR SIDE COURT GAMES (depending on court availability):

On a jump ball, the ball will be given to the team according to the alternating possession arrow. On every dead ball, the ball must be passed in from the sideline or end line nearest it went out of bounds. After any change in possession during play, the ball must be taken out of bounds before continuing play down the court. There will be a 15 minute time limit from the start of each game. A 2 minute half-time will be taken when the first team reaches 8 pts in grades 4-6 and 10 pts. in grades 7, 8, & open class. If neither team reaches those point totals after 10 minutes, a 2 minute half time will be taken. If the score is tied after 15 minutes a tie-breaker will be used to determine the winner. When a tie occurs at the end of regulation time, a two minute overtime will be played. If either team scores the total number of points during the over time, they will immediately win. If after the overtime period the game is still tied, the following will occur. Each player from each team will shoot 1 free-throw with the team making the most free throws winning. (If a team has less than 5 players, they will shoot another for each player less than five.) Each team is allowed 2 one minute time-outs per game. The clock will stop when a time-out is taken. Teams must attack the basket on the offense. No stalling will be allowed. If there is a lack of activity by the offense the official will first warn the team and if it should occur again then it will be followed with loss of possession. All other normal rules of basketball are still in effect.

4. There will be **no dunking allowed during warm ups or games** and will result in a technical foul. Repetitive offenses will result in team removal from the bracket.

5. Each team will get **7 fouls** that will result in the change of possession of the ball to the team being fouled. On the 8th foul and thereafter, the team being fouled will get one free-throw attempt and possession of the ball. **No individual player can foul out.** The basket will count if the shot is made on a shooting foul.

6. **Foul language and/or extensive questioning of the referees will result in a technical foul. Receipt of a technical foul will automatically give the opposing team 2 pts. And the possession of the basketball. If a player or coach receives their second technical foul in one game, that team will be disqualified for the remainder of the tournament. Fans may be asked to leave for bad behavior.**

7. Each Bracket will have one seeding game per team and then be placed into a double or single elimination bracket (based on the number of teams in the bracket). Seeding will be based on **1st-win or loss; 2nd-most point differential; 3rd- minutes to win.**

8. No team will be scheduled to play two games in a row (except in rare circumstances where required), so **NO TEAM** should be late for games. Any team who arrives more than 3 minutes late for their scheduled game may be forced to **forfeit that game**.

9. All teams, coaches and referees must check in at the Tournament headquarters table. (located near the entrance/concession area of the Gym.) Team participants, parent signatures, and team name will be checked. Be sure to check brackets at this time for any changes that had to be made since your original game times.

10. **Tournament directors reserve the right to combine age groups and select brackets that best meet each division's needs. Any rules or guidelines that need clarifications should be determined by the game official or if need be the Event Director. The Event Director maintains the rite to change, adjust, or determine the interpretation of these rules as needed for the benefit of the tournament.**

Divisions: BOYS AND GIRLS in grades 4, 5, 6, 7, 8:
Divisions are determined by the grade in which the players are entering in the fall.

CLOSED DIVISION:

These grades will only play versus teams of their own grade level unless there is an insufficient number of teams for a grade

OPEN DIVISION:

Bracket Echo: This bracket is for high school boys grades 9th-12th. Adults and parents (male) may play in the Open Division. These teams DO NOT have to be from the same grade, but must be in high school or above. All teams in Open Bracket Echo may play against each other.

Bracket Delta: This bracket is for high school girls grades 9th-12th. Adults and parents (female) may play in the Open Division. These teams DO NOT have to be from the same grade, but must be in High School or above. All teams in Open Bracket Delta may play against each other.

Rosters: Rosters must contain complete information on each player. All teams may have no more than five players. Athletes may play up a grade level but NOT down. (This does not pertain to the open division). Teams must provide their own uniforms (a limited supply of balls will be available). If under 18 a parent of each player must sign the entry form. Players may play on only ONE team.

Rules: Rules will be sent out along with game schedules.

Entries: Entries will be accepted up through June 6, 2023. Entry forms must be filled out completely and accompanied by an entry fee of \$75.00 per team (This is the Early Bird price until May 23rd. After May 23rd fee is \$90). You may call or e-mail the registration then bring the signed forms the day of the tournament.

Format: Each team is guaranteed no less than two games and hopefully will play more.

Awards: Individual awards will be given for 1st and 2nd place teams of each bracket.

Concessions: Food and beverages will be available throughout the tournament.

Admission: Spectator viewing is welcome and encouraged!
Admission is only \$2.00 for students and \$3.00 for adults.
